

Eighteen: (1) $2 \times 9 = 18$; as such 18 means: Judgment by the Word of God; or (2) Judgment by division (mutual destruction); or, (3) Fruitful association; Alternatively 18 may mean: (4) $10 + 8 = 18$; As such 18 means: Complete new beginning; or (5) Complete putting off of the old man.

Elite: (1) Apostle; (2) Choice or chosen; (2) Valiant warrior.
